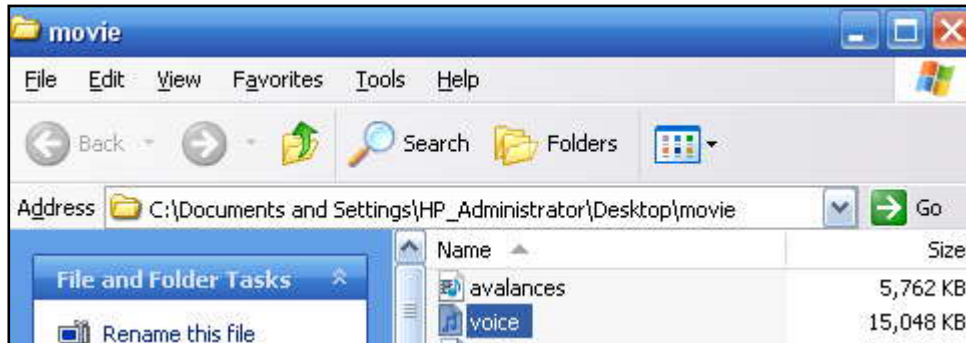


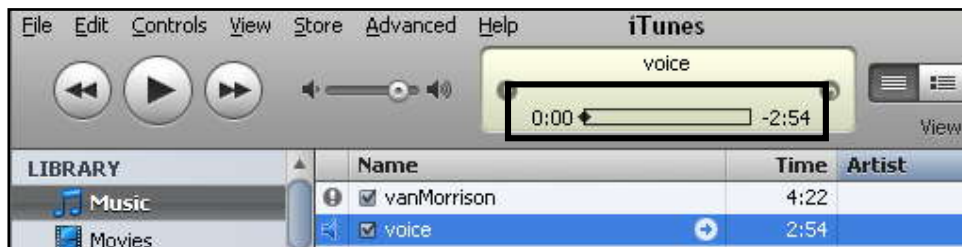
# preparing for your movie:

**Directions:** You should have your sound prepared for your movie before continuing with this lesson. Once you understand the basic steps, you can fill in the table to

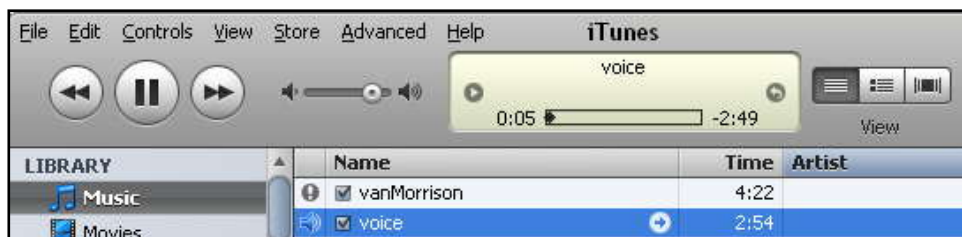
1. Open up your edited sound by double clicking on its **icon** in your music folder.



2. Your sound could open in a variety of formats. In this example, it opened in iTunes. Take note of where the sound is in relation to seconds.
3. Find the location of the **timing** so that you can have a general idea what image or video to insert at certain times of the recording. Notice it hasn't started playing and it will last 2 minutes and 54 seconds.



4. Identify the **rewind, fast forward, pause and play** buttons so that you can continue to pause while you take rough notes on images or videos you might want to get for certain segments of the sound. For instance, in reference to avalanches, the most important concept mentioned in the **first 5 seconds of the sound was tons of snow moving at 200 miles per hour**. I would then look for an image that shows a powerful avalanche or get a video demonstrating a powerful avalanche.



5. Fill out the **keywords for research** document titled **keywords.doc**. It will look something like the example below. You might not necessarily fill out every row or you might need more rows. To add another row, click in the last row, last column and press the tab key of your keyboard.
